

JACK LEVIN, Ph.D. co-directs the Brudnick Center on Violence and Conflict at Northeastern University in Boston. He has authored or co-authored more than 30 books, including *Serial Killers and Sadistic Murderers—Up Close and Personal*, *Extreme Killing*, *Why We Hate*, *Hate Crimes Revisited*, and *The Violence of Hate*. Dr. Levin has also published more than 200 articles and columns in professional journals, magazines, and newspapers (such as *the New York Times*, *the London Sunday Times*, *the Boston Globe*, *USA Today*, *the Washington Post*, *the Christian Science Monitor*, *the Dallas Morning News*, and *the Chicago Tribune*), and has appeared frequently on national television programs (such as Oprah, Good Morning America, Today, 48 Hours, 20/20, America’s Most Wanted, The O’Reilly Factor, and Larry King Live). Levin was honored by the Massachusetts Council for the Advancement and Support of Education as its “Professor of the Year.” He recently received a major award from the American Sociological Association for his efforts to increase the public understanding of sociology and also was the recipient of the Apple Award from the New England Sociological Association and the Lester Ward Award from the Association of Applied and Clinical Sociology. In 2013, he received a Lifetime Achievement Award for his research in criminology from the Society for the Study of Social Problems. Levin has spoken to a wide variety of community, academic, and professional groups, including the White House Conference on Hate Crimes, the Department of Justice, the Department of Education, OSCE’s Office for Democratic Institutions and Human Rights (a membership of 59 countries), the National Organization of Hostage Negotiators, forensic psychiatrists from the Royal College of Psychiatry in the UK, and the

International Association of Chiefs of Police.
